The Fallen Officers Will Host The First Annual Garrett Hull Blue Bowl Co-Ed Flag Football Tournament Presented by Higginbotham Insurance June 15, 2019!

May 15, 2019 (Naples, FL): The Fallen Officers will host their First Annual Co-Ed Flag Football Tournament called “The Garrett Hull Blue Bowl Co-Ed Flag Football Tournament Presented by Higginbotham Insurance June 15, 2019 at Farrington Field in Forth Worth Texas from 8am-5:00pm to benefit the family of Fallen Fort Worth Officer Corporal Garrett Hull. We will have a memorial service with the color guard, bag pipes and presenting of the checks to the family. presenting of the checks to the family. We will have current and former NFL players on site for pictures and autographs.

Corporal Garrett Hull died 9-14-18 after he succumbed to a gunshot wound sustained the previous night as he and other members of the Criminal Intelligence Unit attempted to apprehend three armed robbery suspects.

The officers had been conducting surveillance of the three suspects, who had been involved in more than 15 armed robberies in which three people were shot. The suspects entered a bar on the 400 block of West Biddison Street shortly before midnight and robbed the 10 patrons at gunpoint. As they fled from the building the officers attempted to take them into custody.

All three suspects attempted to flee on foot into the surrounding neighborhood. During the foot pursuit, one of the men opened fire, striking Corporal Hull in the head. Other officers returned fire and killed the subject before placing Corporal Hull in a patrol car and transporting him to a hospital. Corporal Hull succumbed to his wounds the following evening.

Corporal Hull had served with the Fort Worth Police Department for 17 years. He is survived by his wife and two daughters. He was posthumously promoted to the rank of corporal.
